Call for Abstracts & Papers

Participants wishing to make a presentation on the results of their recent research / practice are cordially invited to submit abstract according to the below mentioned instructions. Accepted papers will be presented either in oral or poster sessions.

Important Guidelines:

- It is mandatory for all authors to submit their abstract online. The offline abstract by post, the scanned copy OR by any other means will not be accepted.
- For multiple abstract submissions, the author has to re-login with same E-mail ID but different password(s). There is no limit for the no. of abstract submissions an author can submit.
- For abstract submission, registration is not mandatory. Authors need to choose their relative category on online software and proceed. However, in case the registration fee is not received till 31st October 2010, the papers will not be considered for presentation.

Abstract Format:

For all of the categories, the abstract should be in the following:

- Title should be in capital letters, double spaced between the title and the presenter's names, single spaced between the presenter's name and the text of the abstract and abstract in single space.
- Write author/presenter's name and E-mail ID just below the title.
- The abstract should be typed in Times New Roman and a 12 font size.
- **For Free papers, Award Papers, Invited Guest talks and Posters** - the combined length of the abstract body, title, aim, methodology and conclusion should not exceed 200 words.
- **For Oration**, it is required to attach a passport size photograph and write a 150 words CV along with the abstract. The CV should be written first followed by the abstract in the same document. The combined length of the CV and abstract body should not exceed 1000 words.

Declaration of Conflict of Interest:

All participants shall disclose to the audience any significant conflict of interests including financial or any other relationships with manufacturers of commercial products (including drugs, equipments etc) or services discussed in their presentations. The disclosure is not to prevent a speaker with a significant relationship with a product from speaking about the product, but rather to judge whether speaker's interests and relationships have influenced the presentation. If there is no interest to declare, then a "nothing to disclose" declaration shall be made.

Online abstract should be uploaded in .doc file (word format) only. Maximum size of the file is 200 kb.

General Rules for Awards, Medals, and Prizes

1. Time allotted is 7 minutes.
2. Text Photo and table slides by power point presentation only. Total slides 16, to keep the clarity and visibility, each slide should not contain more than 8 lines.
3. Name of the presenter and the institute are not to be displayed during competition but may be mentioned while submission of abstracts and while announcing the result.
4. The participant must be a member of our Association and must register his/her name as a delegate to the National Conference and must mention his/her AM/LM number.
5. A summary of the paper of approximately 200 words should accompany the application.
6. The work may be of the competitor alone or may be of a group of persons, but the competitor's name must be the first amongst them.
7. While selecting the participants for the award of medals and prizes, preference will be given to those participants who have not participated earlier if the subject and the quality of the work of both the participant, i.e., those who have participated earlier and those who are participating fresh appear to be similar. This is to create room for other competitors.
8. Questions, for clarification, if any, should be from the judges only, after the completion of the presentation.

Members of the Scientific Committee and the IADVL Academy have the discretionary power to select a total of 12 entries, in the event of more entries, for the Award Papers.

Criteria for short listing of papers for IADVL Award Section:

1. Valid membership of IADVL: to be confirmed by Honorary General Secretary of IADVL
2. **Eligibility**
 - a. 1-2 years for membership less than 35 yrs
 - b. 3 years for more than 35 yrs
 - c. 5 years for more than 40 yrs
3. All submitted papers' summaries will be circulated to all members of scientific committee and IADVL Academy of Dermatology.

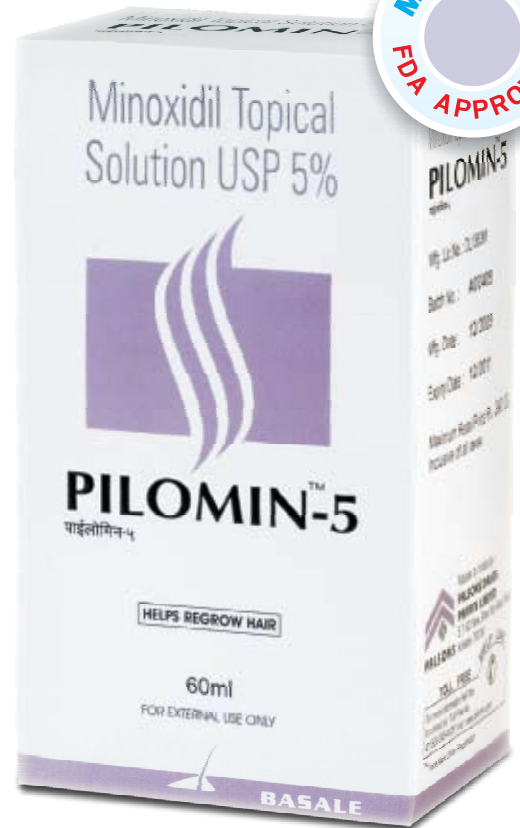

Selection Procedure:

 4. The names of three nominees will be selected and discussed with the Central Scientific Committee for final approval.
 5. The final decision will be taken during the meeting of the Central Scientific Committee.
 6. The Hon. General Secretary shall intimate the selected awardees that an award will be given during the IADVL felicitation day during DERMACON-2011.
- C. **Dr. L. Marquis Memento Award** for best lecture delivered by a guest speaker.
This award is given by the scientific committee of DERMACON-2011 in consultation with the National Executive of IADVL.

Free Papers & Award Papers

Instructions for presenters:

- The presenter should essentially be a member of IADVL (LM/ALM/PLM).
- Time allotted is 7 minutes.
- Test, photo and table slides by power point presentation only.
- Total slides – 16 for award papers.
- Name of the presenter and the institution are not to be displayed during award papers presentation but may be mentioned while submission of abstracts and while announcing the result.
- Slides should not be overcrowded with material and should be able to be read by the audience. Hence, each slide should not contain more than 8 lines.
- Presentation by the speakers should be clear and audible with proper explanation, wherever necessary.
- More than one paper can be presented by a delegate. However, the scientific committee will have the option to shift the free paper to poster presentation.
- Questions, for clarification, if any, should be from the judges only, after the completion of the presentation.
- Pre-registration for the conference is compulsory.
- Online abstract submission is mandatory. Please follow the instructions on conference website.
- Acceptance or otherwise will be informed to the presenters by November 15th, 2010.

Poster Presentation

Guidelines for Poster Presentation

- Online abstract submission is mandatory. Please follow the instructions on conference website.
- Pre-registration for conference is compulsory for poster presentation.
- Poster accepted for the conference will be the exclusive property of DERMACON-2011.

Abstract for Research outcome presentation should include:

Introduction:	Concisely state the main objective of the study.
Methodology:	Describe the design of the study, the setting and the patients involved.
Results:	To be included and summarized with relevant statistical analysis.
Conclusion:	Should be directly supported by the data.

Abstract for case report presentation should include:

Introduction:	Concisely describe the rarity of the case.
Case Report:	Describe the clinical presentation of the case or the uniqueness of the surgical technique adopted.
Conclusion:	Concisely conclude the case report.

Poster Size: should be 3 ft (width) x 4 ft (height). Poster of size in excess of these dimensions will not be permitted to be displayed. Each poster will be allotted a number which will be displayed on the poster boards. Avoid using plain paper and also sticking multiple A4 size sheets for poster. Mention the name, address and the e-mail of the author at the bottom left of the poster in capital letters.

Presenting authors will be required to be present at a specified time (to be intimated later) by the poster side for discussion with judges for best poster award.

Other necessary information will be displayed on website in due course of time.

General Information

Host City – Gurgaon, NCR, India

Gurgaon, located in the National Capital Region, is the most rapidly developing colonnade of greater Delhi. It lies close to the international and domestic airports. Also known as the millennium city, it has emerged as the hub of IT and other new age businesses. Its proximity to the national capital of Delhi is an added advantage. It enjoys all the facilities available in Delhi. Gurgaon is home to offices of several MNCs, and is well linked by rail and road to Delhi, Faridabad and Jaipur.

The origin of the city's name is steeped in Hindu mythology. Legend has it that Gurgaon was the ancestral village of Guru Dronacharya, the teacher of the Pandavas and Kauravas in the Indian epic, Mahabharata. In Sanskrit, Guru means teacher, which in this case refers to Dronacharya and Gram means village. According to Hindu mythology, the village was gifted by the Pandavas and Kauravas to Dronacharya, the son of Rishi Bhardwaj, and was, therefore, known as Gurugram. Over time, colloquial term gaon (which also means village in Prakrit) was substituted for gram and the name Gurgaon emerged.



What to expect

to Mata Sheetla Devi - the goddess of small-pox, it is visited by several people of all religions and beliefs.

Damdama Lake:

Positioned a few kilometers to the south of Gurgaon, off Alwar road, Damdama lake is an amazing tourist spot. The adventure resort at Water Banks offers deluxe tents along the lake.

Sohna:

The town is specially remarkable for its hot springs. In ancient times, it was a place of rishis and the main kund (tank) was called Shiv Kund. Famed for medicinal properties, these sulphur springs were visited by foreign tourists during the British period.



Neemrana Fort:

This Fort-Palace is among India's oldest heritage resorts. Neemrana became the third capital of the descendants of Prithviraj Chauhan III, who was killed in battle by Mohammad Ghori in 1192 AD.

Weather

Gurgaon has a charming weather in February. Day time temperature is 20 - 25 Degree Centigrade. Light woollen clothing is essential.

Visa

All visitors coming from overseas will require visas which can be obtained from the Indian missions abroad. One should possess a valid passport.

Full Day Delhi: Tour code: AT 1

Duration: 08 hours (Starting Time: 0900 hrs)

Qutab Minar (tower) was built in the year 1212 A.D and stands at a height of 72.5 meters in the courtyard of the Quwwat-ul-Islam masjid.



Lotus Temple, a prominent attraction in Delhi, is a Baha'i House of Worship shaped like the Lotus flower.

Humayun's Tomb is believed to have been designed by his widow. Its plan, based on the description of Islamic paradise gardens, is known to have inspired the Taj Mahal and many later Mughal tombs.

Red Fort, built in red sandstone, is a 17th century fort complex constructed by the Mughal Emperor Shahjahan in the walled city of Old Delhi (in present day Delhi, India).

Jama Masjid is the principal mosque of Old Delhi in India and was commissioned by the Mughal Emperor Shah Jahan in 1650 A.D.

India Gate, originally known as All India War Memorial, was built in the memory of 90,000 Indian soldiers killed in the First World War.



Parliament House, designed by Herbert Baker, is a circular colonaded structure, originally the Circular House, and now popularly known as the Sansad Bhawan.

President House was originally built to be the official residence of the Viceroy, then known as the Viceroy Palace, and is the

crowning glory of British architecture in India and now houses the President of India.

Temple Tour : Tour code: AT 2

Duration: 08 hours (Starting Time 0900 hrs)

Lakshmi Narayan Temple, an enchanting temple located west of Connaught Place, was built by Raja Baldev Das in 1938.

Gurudwara Bangla Sahib is a Sikh Shrine dedicated to Guru Harkrishan Sahib and is situated in the heart of New Delhi. Its original name was Jaisinghpura Palace owned by Mirza Raja Jai Singh.

Cathedral Church was designed by, Henry Medd, a British architect. It took around eight years to build the church and was completed in the year 1933.

Akshardham temple, a unique & beautiful monument built without steel, consists of 234 ornately carved pillars, 9 ornate domes, 20 quadrangled shikhars, spectacular Gajendra Pith (plinth of stone elephants) and 20,000 murtis and statues of India's great sadhus, devotees, acharyas and divine personalities.

Shopping Tour: Tour Code: AT 3

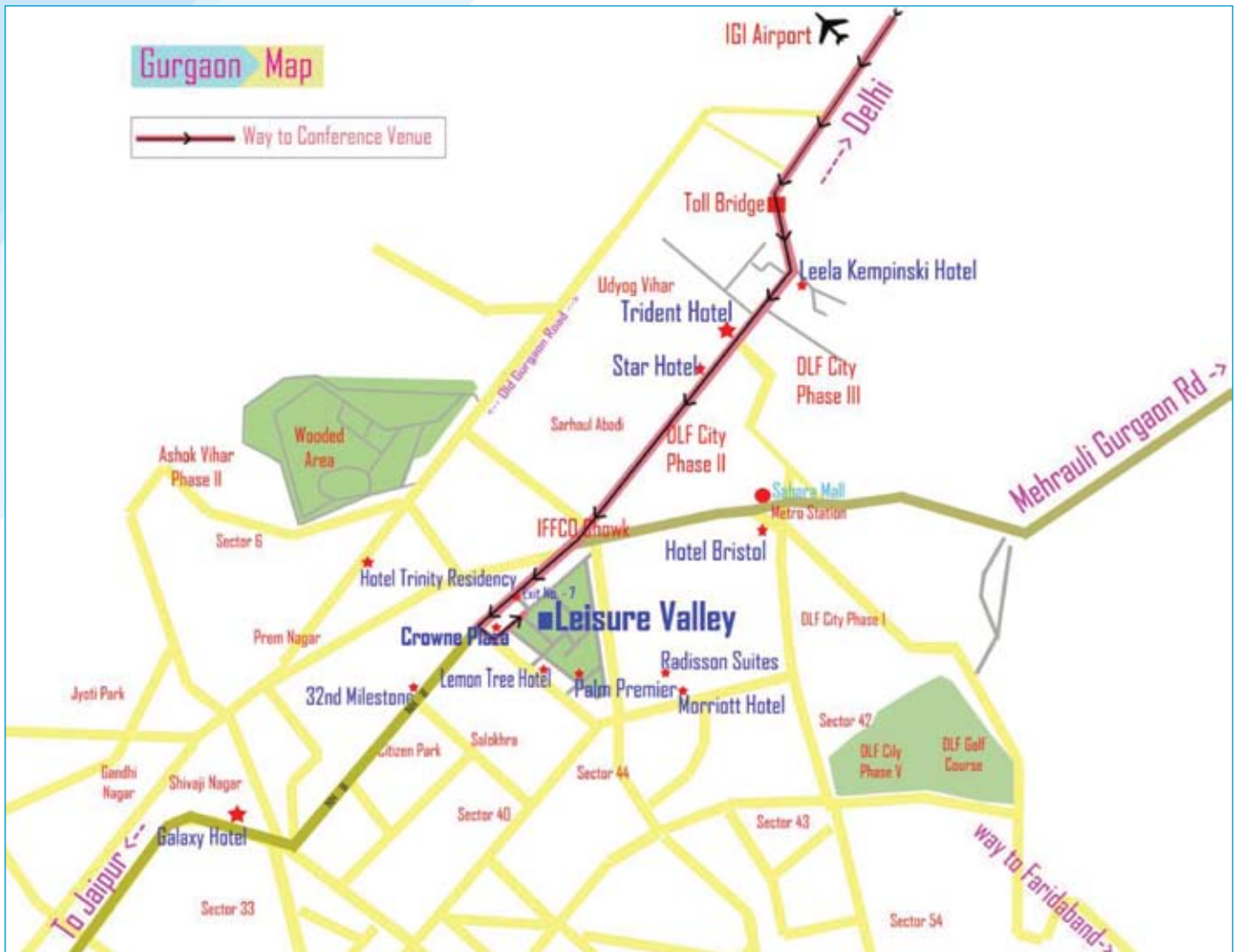
